#### FRAMING THE CONVERSATION

This guide is designed to prompt thinking and help you have discussions about the Voice to Parliament Referendum 2023.

It uses graphics, links to key online information sources and presents a range of ideas and questions.



#### What you will be asked in the 2023 Referendum

The Parliament passed the Constitution Alteration Bill on Monday 19 June 2023. The Bill proposes to add a new 'Chapter IX – Recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples' at the end of the Constitution.

The proposed chapter will hold a new section: **129 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice** 

In recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the First Peoples of Australia:

- there shall be a body, to be called the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice;
- the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice may make representations to the Parliament and the Executive Government of the Commonwealth on matters relating to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples;
- the Parliament shall, subject to this Constitution, have power to make laws with respect to matters relating to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice, including its composition, functions, powers and procedures.

If you are enrolled to vote you will be required to vote on an Electoral ballot paper, and write your answer YES or NO.

#### The 5 Scenarios

- 1. Stabilising the Base High NO Vote

- 3. Just Over the Line Marginal YES Vote
- 4. Narrow Escape Marginal NO Vote
- 5. Mixed Message National YES Vote, but states are locked at 3 YES and 3 NO
